Dear Saul & Michael:

The recently approved SNAP collaboration membership policy requires that Fermilab examine its request for membership, sent to you on January 15, 2003, and assure ourselves that the individual scientists who are part of the Fermilab SNAP group meet the criteria for membership in the appropriate category. We have done so, and here is our modified request.

1. Institutional Membership: At the present time, Fermilab has 14 scientists who have committed to being full members, 10 who meet the criteria for Associate Membership, and one Affiliated Member.

2. Individual full members: The following have committed to the requirements of full membership in SNAP, which they expect to be their major research effort now or in the near future. In general, each member and associate member has an interest in one or more of the deliverables listed in our original letter, and has a science interest in either the supernovae survey or the wide-area survey, or both.
